- Brown, Raymond E., Fitzmyer, Joseph A., and Murphy, Roland E, editors. *The New Jerome Biblical Commentary*. Upper Saddle River, NJ: Prentice-Hall, Inc., 1968. (This reference book is a compact commentary on the entire Bible that readers can use to familiarize themselves with the methods and paths followed by biblical scholars. Commentary includes articles on Jesus, the early Church, Gnosticism, and the sub-apostolic church. Especially for seminarians and clergy who require a commentary on the Scriptures both during their formal study of theology and for preaching in their ministry. Also, for those interested in religion and theology on all levels and feel the need for an adequate background in the Bible.)
- Farley, Fr. Laurence R. *The Gospel of Mark: The Suffering Servant*. Ben Lomond, CA: Conciliar Press, 2004. (Orthodox Priest writing in conjunction with the *Orthodox Study Bible*. Good layman's commentary from an Orthodox perspective.)
- Oden, Thomas C. and Christopher A. Hall, editors. *Ancient Christian Commentary on Scripture: New Testament II, Mark*. Gen. Editor Thomas Oden. Downers Grove, IL: Intervarsity Press, 1998. (Excellent reference series using the Fathers of the Church. This series selects, edits, and in many cases translates for the first time into English commentary material by the Fathers of the Church East and West. A treasure trove of information.)
- Theophylact, the Blessed. *The Explanation by the Bl. Theophylact of the Holy Gospel according to St. Mark*. Vol. II in the series: *Bl. Theophylact's Explanation of the New Testament*. Trans. Fr. Christopher Stade. House Springs, MO: Chrysostom Press, 1997. (Orthodox. 11th Century Bishop of Ochrid. He draws on the works of previous Church Fathers and summarizes the basic Eastern Orthodox interpretive position. Valuable concise work.)
- Trakatellis, Demetrios, Archbishop of America. *Authority and Passion: Christological Aspects of the Gospel According to Mark*. Brookline, MA: Holy Cross Orthodox Press, 1987. (A masterful piece of scholarship which carefully examines and explains the Gospel of Mark. The Archbishop demonstrates that the book of Mark presents a portrait of Jesus in terms of divine authority and human passion. "His close literary and theological reading of the text could serve as a good primer on Mark's presentation of Jesus." [Journal of Biblical Literature])
